Programme Description:

Energy transition has increasingly acquired importance in Europe, becoming a key aspect of policy and central to many discussions.

In the wake of the European Green Deal and the recent Covid-19 crisis, energy transition needs to be fully understood in order to permeate society

and

effectively happen, overcoming technological, regulation, financial and social barriers. The debate often focuses more on technology and policy; however, it is essential to have a society equipped with the right knowledge and skills in order to make the transition happen, reaching and maintaining carbon-neutrality.

The Horizon2020 ASSET project aims to help tackle these issues by creating an ecosystem for learning, involving education centers, industry, policymakers and a wider community of energy citizens where all can interact, exchanging learning opportunities for knowledges and skills on energy transition. ASSET has therefore created an online community with a European-wide presence, providing a series of MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) on specific energy transition topics that can help develop the knowledge and skills needed for the sector.

Being a community, ASSET has also organized two Roadshows in Italy and Spain, involving different sets of national, regional and local stakeholders to discuss on different topics revolving around energy transition and education.

The third and final Roadshow will take place online on Autumn 2020. Belgian and European policymakers and authorities will meet industries and representatives from sector-based European organisations to engage in dynamic discussions aimed at understanding how policy can pave the way for effective cooperation in educating for energy transition. The event will be divided in two sessions; the first will focus on how policy can facilitate the transmission and access to energy transition skills and knowledge while the second will be dedicated to how to feed this demand.

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
